You can help at home by: helping your child to practise the 4 times tables.

Year 4

We have been learning: the other times tables we were yet to learn. We now know all tables up to 12×12 !

You can help at home by: asking random times tables questions and encouraging Times Tables Rock stars.

Year 5

We have been learning: about the American Civil War in English.

You can help at home by: coming up with questions to ask those involved e.g. Abraham Lincoln.

Year 6

We have been learning: how the voltage in a circuit affects the loudness of a buzzer.

You can help at home by: asking your child how we designed our experiment and what we discovered.
