The Month of the Rosary

During this month dedicated to the Rosary and Our Lady, it has been wonderful to see the children using our chapel sessions as a time for quiet reflection and prayer. Many classes have been praying the Hail Mary together and learning more about the life of Our Lady. We are also encouraging children to offer their own intentions for prayer. In each classroom, children can write a moment of joy or sorrow on a cardboard leaf from the prayer table. It can be a big step moving from class worship to the hall with the whole school, but they have been excellent listeners and are already joining in beautifully with our prayer to St Louis. It's lovely to see their confidence growing week by week.

Our Year 5 pupils have been taking part in Bikeability training, learning how to ride safely on the roads and how to check their bikes are in good working order. The instructors were very impressed with their listening skills and positive attitude. I would highly recommend that any family with children old enough to take part in this training consider signing up when the opportunity arises—it's such a valuable skill for life and helps build independence and confidence.

Nursery

We have been learning: This week's book, 'Driving my tractor'. The children are really enjoying this story.

Reception

We have been learning: how to make and continue different repeating patterns.

You can help at home by: encouraging your child to make different patterns using objects e.g. pencil, car, pencil, car

Year 1

We have been learning: zig-zag letters in handwriting.

You can help at home by: practising letters v, w, x and z with your child.

Year 2

We have been learning: about the Great Fire of London.

You can help at home by: seeing if your child can remember why the fire spread so quickly.

Year 3

We have been learning: to make ten first when adding a number.

You can help at home by: encouraging your child to partition numbers when adding. For example 34+9=34+6=40 and 40+3=43

Year 4

We have been learning: about rounding to estimate in maths.

You can help at home by: asking your child what they need to do in order to round 636+794 to the nearest hundred to get an estimated answer.

Year 5

We have been learning: about factors and multiples.

You can help at home by: making sure your child is confident with their 6, 7, 8 and 9 times tables.

Year 6

We have been learning: about long division.

You can help at home by: asking the steps they would use to divide by a 2-digit number.
