## Learning at St Louis

### Nursery

**We have been learning:** about kindness and how we should be kind to each other here in nursery and at home with our family.

**You can help at home by:** talking to your child about kindness. Encourage your child to be kind to siblings and friends too.

### Reception

**We have been learning:** how to work as a team and listen to other people's ideas.

**You can help at home by:** working with your child to build/make something together.

### Year 1

**We have been learning:** to read and write tricky words.

**You can help at home by:** practising tricky words with your child.

### Year 2

**We have been learning:** about 2D and 3D shapes.

**You can help at home by:** seeing if your child can spot any shapes in your home and when you are out.

### Year 3

**We have been learning:** the 8 times tables.

**You can help at home by:** practicing the 8 times tables with your child.

### Year 4

**We have been learning:** about a Tudor Christmas and the feast that Kings and Queens would eat including many birds.

**You can help at home by:** asking which birds were stuffed inside each other as a Christmas feast.

### Year 5

**We have been learning:** how to multiply a 3 digit by a 2 digit number.

**You can help at home by:** asking your child to show you the method used e.g.  $568 \times 24$

### Year 6

**We have been learning:** about whether Ancient Maya should be remembered.

**You can help at home by:** asking your child to tell you some reasons from both points of view.
