

Learning at St Louis

Nursery



We have been learning: the nursery rhyme 'Old MacDonald had a farm'.

You can help at home by: singing the nursery rhyme together and talking about the different animals you find on a farm.

Reception

We have been learning: about God during our RE lessons. We know God created our world with beautiful things within it.

You can help at home by: taking your child for a walk to find beautiful things that God created.

Year 1

We have been learning: to form our letters correctly.

You can help at home by: helping your child form their letters the right way round.

Year 2

We have been learning: about the story of Noah from the Bible.

You can help at home by: asking your child about the different symbols in the story, like the dove, rainbow and altar.

Year 3

We have been learning: about joints in the body

You can help at home by: pointing to a joint on the body and asking if it is a ball and socket joint or a hinge joint.

Year 4

We have been learning: about rounding to 10, 100 and 1000 in maths.

You can help at home by: asking how to round to 100 - which digits and columns to look at.

Year 5

We have been learning: about pop up books in D&T.

You can help at home by: asking your child which mechanisms they have used in their books.

Year 6

We have been learning: about factors and prime numbers.

You can help at home by: asking how we identify if a number is a prime number.
