Learning at St Louis



Nursery

We have been learning: about emotions through our book of the week- Grumpy frog. You can help at home by: talking to your child about their emotions and helping them to recognize their own feelings and those of others.

Reception

We have been learning: how to share objects equally. You can help at home by: encouraging your child to share objects equally between two or three teddies.

Year 1

We have been learning: to apply our phonics.

You can help at home by: practising reading real and nonsense words.

Year 2

We have been learning: to tell the time on an analogue clock. You can help at home by: practising this at different times of the day by seeing if your child can tell you what the time is.

Year 3

We have been learning: how to tell time to the minute. You can help at home by: asking your child to tell the time on both analogue and digital clocks, clearly stating the hour and exact minutes.

Year 4

We have been learning: about the properties of shapes in maths. You can help at home by: asking your child what are the properties of a triangle and to name the 4 types.

Year 5

We have been learning: how to estimate and measure angles. You can help at home by: asking your child how they would use a protractor to measure angles.

Year 6

We have been learning: about how to stay safe online. You can help at home by: asking your children what they do to remain safe online
